Surgery at THVC...

At THVC we offer elective sterilization, declaw and most soft-tissue surgeries. We also provide dental procedures. Our patients are monitored under anesthesia by a state-of-the-art VetSpecs monitor that tracks the patient's ECG, pulse, oxygen levels, and respiratory rate. We utilize high-quality anesthetics and pain medications to keep animals as comfortable as possible.

We have an agreement with Dr. Cal Kobluk, a board-certified veterinary surgeon from St. Cloud, to provide high-end surgical services on-site. We work with Marcia Swanson, CVT, to provide extended rehabilitation care for surgery patients.

Large Animal Services at THVC...

Dr. Justin Dahl provides limited ambulatory service for horses, cows, and other farm animals. In addition to routine preventative care visits (such as vaccination and Coggins Testing), he can provide limited diagnostic services (including on-site radiology) and limited on-site surgery as well. Dr. Dahl works out of the Grand Avenue office (628-0301).

Pharmacy Services at THVC...

Our pharmacy allows our clients to obtain most medications on-site. We also can have Prescription Specialties in Duluth prepare any medications that we do not carry.


Medical Care for THVC Patients...

Diagnostics at THVC...

THVC features both on-site diagnostic capabilities and satellite referral to Grand Avenue Veterinary Clinic in West Duluth, allowing us to make a diagnosis without delay.

We feature the Idexx VetTest analyzer, allowing us access to chemistry results within 30 minutes of animal's presentation in the clinic. Our lab also allows us to perform fecal analysis, cytology, and numerous other condition-specific tests.

Radiology cases are referred to GAVC in West Duluth, where a digital processor can provide superior-quality images that can then be accessed by THVC veterinarians remotely to provide continued local care.

We work with Dr. Ralph Weischelbaum, a board-certified radiologist from the Twin Cities, to provide ultrasound diagnostics. Dr. Weischelbaum performs both abdominal ultrasound and echocardiography.
